II. About the Piarist Fathers (Order of the Pious Schools)

We the Piarist Fathers are a Religious Order (Order of the Pious Schools), known in Spanish as, "Orden de las Escuelas Pías", and in Italian "Ordine degli Scuole Pie" (Scolopi). The Order was founded by Saint Joseph Calasanz for the Education of Children and Youth especially the poor. Our mission is therefore to educate most especially the underprivileged of our society. The Piarist Fathers arrived Cameroon in 1987 from Spain (Province of Aragon) and have been very much involved in educational, pastoral and socio-cultural activities. The first Piarists missionaries who arrived Cameroon: Frs. Angel Valenzuela, Fernando Negro and Juan Yzuel with the dream of evangelising the children and youth especially the underprivileged through education.

From January December 2013, the autonomous demarcation of the **PIARIST PROVINCE OF CENTRAL AFRICA** was created comprising four countries: DR Congo, Cameroon, Equatorial Guinea and Gabon, with Rev. Fr. Javier Negro Marco Sch.P as first Superior. At the moment, the Piarists of Central Africa are under the leader of Rev. Fr. Evaristus Akem Ndi, Sch.P as Major Superior.

The Province has been blessed with many vocations. Regarding current statistics, the Province counts a total of 110 religious, of which 10 are Europeans and the rest, native, the average age being 36 years. Of the 110 religious, 50 are priests, 3 are deacons, 2 brothers (of solemn vows) and 72 are religious with simple profession, of which 34 are studying philosophy, 23 studying theology and 15 are living and working in active communities. In addition to this, we have 21 novices and 15 Postulants (Prenovices).

Initial Formation houses:

- Pre-Novitiate in Menteh/Cameroon with 10 prenovices and Prenovitiate Kinshasa (Democratic Republic of Congo with 5 prenovices.
- Novitiate in Kumbo/Cameroun, with 21 novices from 5 different countries (Cameroon, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Democratic Republic of Congo and Nigeria).
- Juniorate I in Bamenda/Cameroun, with 45 juniors in philosophy at the Catholic University of Cameroon Bamenda.
- Juniorate II in Yaoundé/Cameroun, with 19 juniors in theology at the Catholic University of Yaoundé and
- Community experience: 15 Juniors are currently have an experience of our community life as well as our educative ministry in some of our communities. During this moment, they are involved in the education of young persons through classes, pastoral activities as well as socio-cultural actives, helping the underprivileged with the means at their disposal.

Religious Communities are 16, distributed as follows¹

- 9 in Cameroon
- 4 in Equatorial Guinea
- 1 in Gabon (Libreville) and

- 2 in Democratic Republic of Congo, one in Kinshasa created in November 2014 and one in Kikonka created in 2016.

Each religious community is made up with 4 or 5 Piarist religious.

A part from the formation houses whose principal objective is to discern and accompany vocations, the communities are involved in ministerial works ranging from educational works, through pastoral administration to the People of God to socio-cultural activities and assistance to the underprivileged.

III. Project background and Justification

Education is a fundamental right of every child whether rich or poor. Our holy founder St. Joseph Calasanz went to Rome and dedicated himself to the education of children especially the poor. Following this charism and looking at the environment in which we find ourselves we try to follow his footsteps. Most of our schools are situated in villages and we face this problem of some of the children being unable to pay school fees or buying books and other school needs.

This project will help bring education to every child who wants to study and lack the means. There are a handful of children who are orphans who have no one to care for them, children of single parents where the lone parent faces difficulties in educating the children or better still children who leave with parents that have absolutely no source of income. We have most of this vulnerable children are often very intelligence and lack the





means, by this we are going to valorize their potentials and make them feel life like their fellow brothers and sisters who have the opportunity.

Out of the schools we have in Cameroon most of them are found in the North West Region where the socio-political crises have made education a big problem. There is a big difficulty as students don't have the means of going back to school after paying lump sums to no avail. Children need to be coaxed and aided to go to school again as many of them have lost their parents and guardians in this struggle.

We are always very happy when we are able to make a child find life by making him/her go to school because every child has the right to education regardless of the circumstances.

IV. Problem Statement

- Most of our streets are often flooded with children because they are unable to go to school. This increases crime wave as many occupy themselves in criminal activities.
- The gap between the rich and the poor is widened as only children of those who can afford go to school while the underprivileged lament and roam around doing nothing
- The province has been having a drop down in the number children who attend schools because there are many of these children who want to be educated but due to no means tend to remain in their homes. Most of the schools have been empty that we even have no choice than closing them.

Upon completion of the higher level we shall ensure employment for them so that they will serve like a spring board to other underprivileged children which will therefore reduce cost for educating subsequent cases.

Also, a mid-term evaluation will be conducted to assess the general progress of the project. We equally will submit quarterly financial, narrative reports and receipts as a means of verification in order to ensure transparency and effectiveness.

XI. Conclusion

Our schools sustain our charism within the different communities. Our educational priorities are in remote communities, more especially founded on the promotion of the participation of the girl and poor child in education. We however, can't sufficiently attain to this goal if our teachers lack the basic competence. The growth of the community is ensured as many of these educated people will be employed or they will create employment for other people through entrepreneurial skills. Eyes that look are many but those that see are few so education is very important for all.
